Dear Mr. Schock,

I am contacting you in writing as a follow up to my request I made on 2-17-2012 and here again on 2-25-2013 to your office regarding your position on Article II Section I Clause V of our U.S. Constitution, which states "No person except a natural born Citizen, or a Citizen of the United States, at the time of the Adoption of this Constitution, shall be eligible to the Office of President; neither shall any Person be eligible to that Office who shall not have attained to the Age of thirty-five Years, and been fourteen Years a Resident within the United States." I am specifically requesting a signed statement on your behalf what constitutes by law a natural born Citizen. This is a most important question that needs an answer from you. There is a distinction in what separates a natural born Citizen from all other types of citizenship relevant in the U.S., such a distinction, in that this qualification is only stipulated for office of Vice President and President of the United States, not for Senator, Congressman or Governor or any other U.S. governmental office. Your prompt response in this most significant question is respectfully requested of you. Thank you.
