(Whereupon the following proceedings were held in open court, with the defendant present, to-wit:)

THE DEFENDANT: I have people working on one, sir.

THE COURT: All right.

THE DEFENDANT: Can you not hear me, sir?

THE COURT: I can hear you fine.

THE DEFENDANT: Okay. All right.

THE COURT: What do you mean working on? You're

2 **THE DEFENDANT:** We're trying to secure an
3 attorney. Yes, sir.

4 **THE COURT:** All right. And when do you think you
5 will have that resolved?

6 **THE DEFENDANT:** I expected him to be here this
7 morning.

8 **THE COURT:** Okay. Well, if you're going to
9 represent yourself, I need to go through some inquiry
10 with you. That was why I'd asked the bailiff to have
11 you fill out the form. I guess you said you didn't
12 understand. But you're not intending to represent
13 yourself; is that correct?

14 **THE DEFENDANT:** That's not my intention.

15 **THE COURT:** All right. Well, that's wise on your
16 part. It's not a good idea for you to represent
17 yourself, but you need to understand you do have a
18 limited constitutional right to represent yourself, but
19 before I can allow you to do so, I'm going to have to
20 go through an inquiry on your behalf.

21 When do you think you're going to have it worked
22 out as to whether you'll have an attorney or not?

23 **THE DEFENDANT:** I was under the impression I would
24 have an attorney here this morning.

Madam Clerk, in terms of arraignment for today, enter a plea of not guilty on behalf of Mr. Trussell. We've discussed trial date with the --

THE DEFENDANT: Sir, may I ask a question?

THE COURT: You may.

THE DEFENDANT: You're entering a plea for me.

THE COURT: Yes, sir.

THE DEFENDANT: For what?

THE COURT: Because you indicated you're trying to get an attorney and been unable to do so at this point in time. So you're not qualified to represent yourself, nor do you have an attorney here representing you, so I have entered a plea of not guilty on your behalf. So we will proceed.

We're cleared with the court calendar, a trial date starting February 9th, jury selection starting that day, trial -- Mr. Meggs, you have any idea how long the State's presentation will take in this matter?

MR. MEGGS: Your Honor, I really do not at this point. I would anticipate, though, in light of the 14 counts, that it would probably take at least two days to call my witnesses.
