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## STATE OFFICERS ELECTORAL BOARD MEETING SEPTEMBER 17, 2012 EXCERPT FROM PROCEEDINGS

CHAIRMAN McGUFFAGE: Okay. The first 1 matter is the approval of the Rules of Procedure for 2 the State Officers Electoral Board. 3 Has everyone seen a copy of the 4 5 rules? Have there been any changes 6 since the last time, any amendments? 7 MR. SANDVOSS: There are a few minor 8 changes that I made that make the rules more 9 appropriate for today's hearing but the substance of 10 them is not judicial. 11 CHAIRMAN McGUFFAGE: Okay. All 12 right. 13 So consideration of objections 14 to candidate nomination for the November 6, 2012 15 general election, and we have Martin v. Obama, 16 Freeman v. Obama, and Jackson v. Obama. 17 MEMBER BYERS: Mr. Chairman, we need 18 to approve the rules that we're going to follow for 19 this. 20 CHAIRMAN McGUFFAGE: Okay. 21 MEMBER BYERS: I move that we approve 22 the rules for the State Officers Electoral Board as 23

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presented.

Steve, would you give us a summary and give us your recommendation?

MR. SANDVOSS: Yes, Mr. Chairman.

Last Thursday, we received three objections to the candidacy of President Barack Obama; Benjamin Freeman, Michael Jackson and Amanda Martin I believe it is. The sum and substance of the objection and the challenge is to the natural born citizenship of our current president citing the constitutional requirement that the sitting president or a candidate for president indeed be a natural born citizen.

The candidate through counsel submitted three motions to dismiss stating that essentially this case has already been litigated in a previous objection that was filed both by Mr. Freeman and Mr. Jackson in which the hearing officer represented dismissal as the candidate submitted a birth certificate establishing his national born U.S. citizenship.

Also, the motion to dismiss states that the objector did not state his interest,

which is a mandatory requirement of the Election Code, and also, that the objector based his premise upon an incorrect legal interpretation of what constitutes a natural born citizen.

My recommendation in this objection is that pursuant to Rule 3 of the Rules of Procedure in which the board may, on its own motion, strike any objection if it determines it not to be well-grounded in fact or law or is otherwise subject to dismissal, I would recommend that the Board invoke that rule and grant the motion to strike and dismiss submitted by counsel for the candidate and dismiss the objection for the reasons contained in the motion to strike and dismiss.

CHAIRMAN McGUFFAGE: As you pointed out, this objection has no basis in fact or law, and there's also res judicata. Therefore, I move that this objection be dismissed with prejudice.

MEMBER BYERS: Second.

CHAIRMAN McGUFFAGE: Roll call.

MS. CALVIN: Mr. Byers?

MEMBER BYERS: Aye.

MS. CALVIN: Ms. Coffrin?

| 11 | lawyers bringing this complaint here a second time, |
| 12 | you'd be referred to the Supreme Court for          |
| 13 | sanctions. This has no basis in fact or law. It is  |
| 14 | not grounded in law whatsoever, and there's nothing |
| 15 | more to say about it.                               |
| 16 | MR. JACKSON: Sir, First Amendment                   |
| 17 | allows us to freedom of speech.                     |
| 18 | CHAIRMAN McGUFFAGE: Wait. This is                   |
| 19 | an administrative hearing, okay?                    |
| 20 | COURT REPORTER: I need your name,                   |
| 21 | sir.  |
| 22 | MR. JACKSON: Michael Jackson.                       |
| 23 | CHAIRMAN McGUFFAGE: The case has                    |
| 24 | been dismissed. That's it.                          |
