Re: Walter F. Fitzpatrick vs U.S. Navy

Dear Mr. Blasier:

I have been engaged as a Document Examiner by Walter F. Fitzpatrick to examine and compare Question and Standard writings for evidence of authorship of a document entitled RESPONSE TO LETTER OF REPRIMAND, 17 July 1990 which Walter Fitzpatrick claims is a forgery.

Request Standard Writings of Walter F. Fitzpatrick were obtained for comparisons with the suspect document in Question.

Based on my initial examination and comparisons I found numerous indications (based on the copy of the document in question) that Walter F. Fitzpatrick did not sign the document. And further, the document gives evidence of having been produced on a machine of several other documents on U. S. Navy stationery. The following are some of the areas in the signature writing that give evidence that Walter Fitzpatrick did not sign the document:

- spelling
- punctuation
- letter spacings
- segmented writing with hesitations and pen lifts
- letter forms
- pen movements
- entry and exit strokes
- hiatuses
- letter ligatures
- signature formality


It is my belief (if the original can be made available for examination and comparisons) that macro lens photography will give evidence that the signature on the question document was not written by Walter Fitzgerald.

It might also be possible to determine the author of the writing if I can obtain REQUEST WRITING from a suspect writer (Mr. Kevin "Andy" Anderson, U.S. Navy.)

I am enclosing copies of documents that I would like to examine in their original form. If this is possible I could perform the examination and do photography of findings at the U. S. Naval Base in North Chicago, Illinois. I am about 40 minutes from the base.
