Re: Evidence of Inmates Registering & Voting from Prison

Dear Madam Secretary Merrill:

We are writing to inform you that our recent research into the CT Voter Record Database has uncover evidence that indicates a number of current inmates in Connecticut prisons have registered to vote while having prior felonies and still incarcerated. Most appear to have registered to vote while in prison then voted by Absentee ballot, but one inmate somehow appears to have voted in person while serving time in prison. The list we are submitting today included data on 56 inmates.

We are providing the Secretary of State's office this information with the expectation that your staff will take action on what appears to be potential criminal activity, potentially including the acts of inmates and those that may have aided and abetted these acts which violate state laws. We have also filed this information with the SEEC and proper Federal authorities.

Our nonprofit organization remains dedicated to election integrity and the legal foundation of "One vote for one legal voter." ©. With this in mind, we would be glad to meet with you and/or your staff to review this latest finding as well as others research regarding other potential violations of our election laws.
